Lunar Exploration Summer Intern Program

BECOME A LUNAR EXPLORATION SUMMER INTERN!

The Lunar and Planetary Institute (LPI) is hosting a special summer intern program to evaluate possible landing sites for robotic and human exploration missions. The LPI invites applications from graduate students in geology, planetary science, and related programs. The program is also open to undergraduate students in geology, astronomy, chemistry, and physics with at least 50 semester hours of credit so that they, too, can participate in lunar exploration activities. The goal of this program is to integrate NASA's lunar science priorities with the exploration components of the new Constellation program. This will be a unique team activity that should foster extensive discussions among students and senior science team members.

The 10-week program runs from June 1, 2010 through August 9, 2010. Selected interns will receive a \$5000.00 stipend and a \$1000.00 travel expense reimbursement for U.S. citizens or \$1500.00 for foreign nationals.
