

Sample Availability

- Samples will be available from both JAXA and NASA
- The first transfer of samples to NASA happened in Dec
 - Eventually NASA will have10% of the samples
- Details of available samples will be on JAXA and NASA JSC webpages (are actually already there, but it hasn't been announced yet)



Sample Availability

- An announcement of sample availability will be made at the same time from both JAXA and NASA, within the next month, through several avenues including the LPI email distribution system
- Workers can request samples from either NASA or JAXA, or both – but not for the same investigation
- All sample requests will receive peer review
- JAXA and NASA peer reviews will be largely independent, but the allocation oversight committees will talk to each other to identify request overlaps or conflicts

Sample Allocations

 The first samples will probably be allocated this summer

Hayabusa 2
