



19th Annual Partner Meeting in Los Angeles Unites GLOBE's Global Community



The Student Research Experience on Catalina Island drew 29 students from the U.S. and 29 international students for a two-day data collection and analysis intensive focused on land cover and hydrology protocols.



- On July 19-24, 2015, the 2015 Global Learning and Observations to Benefit the Environment (GLOBE) Annual Meeting drew 225 participants from 33 countries: Argentina, Bahrain, Canada, Costa Rica, Croatia, Czech Republic, Dominican Republic, Estonia, France, Germany, Greece, Hungary, India, Israel, Japan, Jordan, Kenya, Mexico, Netherlands, Nigeria, Oman, Pakistan, Peru, Portugal, South Africa, Sri Lanka, Taiwan, Tanzania, Thailand, Trinidad and Tobago, United States, and Uruguay
