Akatsuki

Launched successfully on 21 May 2010
Checkout of instruments enroute to Venus
Failure to get into orbit at Venus
Spacecraft and instruments remain in excellent health
Venus orbit insertion in 4-5 years being worked

Venus Express

Extend mission extended to 2014 (w/mid-term review)
Operations nominal
More data posted to Planetary Science Archive & PDS

Cosmic Vision

EVE and ENVISION not selected
